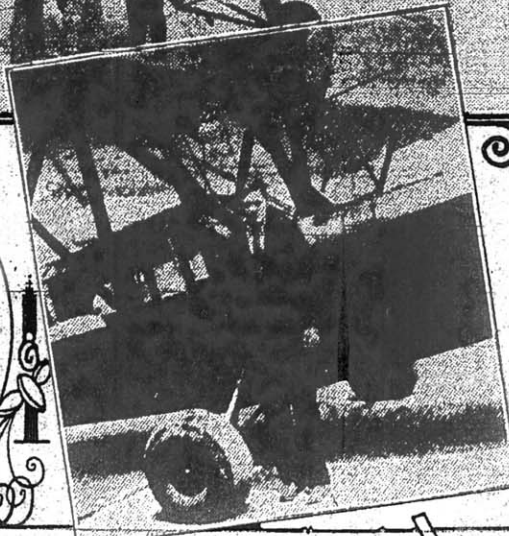
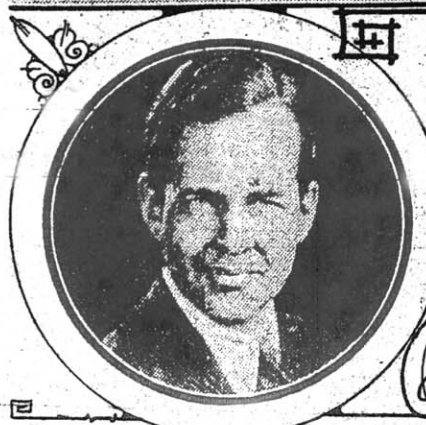

MUCH TALKED OF AUTOGIRO WILL BE SEEN HERE WHEN NATIONAL AIR TOUR VISITS CITY



The much talked of autogiro which will make its first appearance in this section when it arrives Saturday with the National Air Tour, is shown at the top of the pictures above. The ship is said to be able to land by use of its top propeller and with its motor shut off slower than a man in a parachute and can virtually suspend itself in the air over some particular spot. Standing by the autogiro, left to right, is Jimmie Doolittle, former army speed king, who will head the fleet into Birmingham; William B. Mayo, noted designer and chairman of the tour committee; Capt. Lewis A. Yancey, who is piloting the autogiro, and Capt. Ray Collins, tour manager. In the lower left is Edward Pearson Warner, former assistant secretary of the navy, who is accompanying the tour, and in the right lower corner is an amphibian Sikorsky with Pilot Eric Hofman, Boeing mail flier, included in the tour.

DR. WEIZMAN WANTED

British And German Zionists Demand His Relection

BASEL, (P)— Leaders of the British and German delegations to the Zionist Congress re-elected their demand for reelection of Dr. Chaim Weizmann as president of the World Zionist organization. They said they believed he would accept.

The political commission, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency reports, remained deadlocked on a resolution regarding a Jewish majority in Palestine.

General Zionists have offered

compromise resolution which says "the mandatory power shall not hinder the Jewish work leading to a Jewish majority."

The Agency says the labor delegates and Dr. Weizmann would support a modified form of that resolution, but that it is opposed by the revisionists, supported by part of the American delegation.

COOPERATION SEEN AS MONOPOLY FOE

Drastic Regulation Is Urged For Corporations By Senator Brookhart

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va.—(P)—The cooperative economic system was recommended to the University of Virginia Institute of Public Affairs by Senator Brookhart as the best method to combat the growth of monopolies.

The law urged enactment of cooperative banking laws and a cooperative code to encourage the growth of cooperative stores and banks.

Characterizing the growth of chain stores as "the most startling development of monopoly" in this country, Brookhart said the Supreme Court's recent decision permitting states to tax them would provide a valuable weapon to curb their growth.

He said they now do 27 per cent of the retail business in this country and gather 40 per cent of the retail profits on household—40 per cent on wearing apparel, 60 per cent on drugs, 75 per cent on gasoline and by products and 90 per cent on tea.

He urged drastic regulation of corporations in interstate commerce as "absolutely necessary for any final solution of the chain store problem."

FEW WRAPPERS EDIBLE

Public Warned Against Eating Transparent Covering of Goods
ITHACA—(P)—A caution to the public against eating transparent wrappings of cigars and other articles was issued at Cornell University.

The warning was made because while some of these products have been found edible at the university, others contain a finish which is not suitable for eating.

A plan to feed human beings with certain of these wrapping materials as a substitute "roughage" in diet was announced a few days ago at Cornell.

When this news was made public it was believed at the university that the wrapping materials they receive direct from the factory were all the same as that used commercially. It has developed that some of the commercial wrappers are treated with additional materials to add to their covering value.
