CRASH FATAL TO FLIER SUGG

Air Tourist Dies From Injuries

Martins Ferry, Ohio, July 12—
(A. P.)—Aviator Charles Sugg, 30
years old, died in a hospital here
today of a fractured skull received
when his plane smashed into a hill
at Yorkville, Ohio, last Wednesday
while he was participating in the
National Air Tour.

Accompanied by a brother, Harry,
the body was taken late today by
train to Orleans, Mass., for funeral
services and burial.

Sugg had been unconscious 90
hours when he died. In taking off
from Yorkville for Columbus in
continuation of the national tour,
his plane failed to gain sufficient
altitude and hit an elevation ad-
joining the airport.
