# KRAPISH LEADING RELIABILITY TOUR

## Pilot in Speedy Moth. Plane First to Take Off for Macon.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Oct. 12 — (By Associated Press.)—Led by A. Krapish in a speedy moth plane, the twenty-eight pilots in the Ford reliability air tour hopped off from the municipal airport this morning for Macon, Ga., the next stop on their aerial swing around the country. They were followed closely by thirteen other planes accompanying them on the tour.

Krapish took to the air at 9:39 and was followed shortly by N. Wadlow, May Haizlip, Frances Harrell and the remainder of the entries.

The order of landings here from Augusta, Ga., was reversed for the hop off this morning, under rules of the tour.

Krapish, who broke a wing strut and damaged the under-carriage of his plane in landing at Greenville yesterday, arrived here from Augusta this morning and had only a short time to refuel and inspect his ship before taking off again to head the entries to Macon.

The last plane left the field at 10:27 A. M. Fair weather prevailed.
