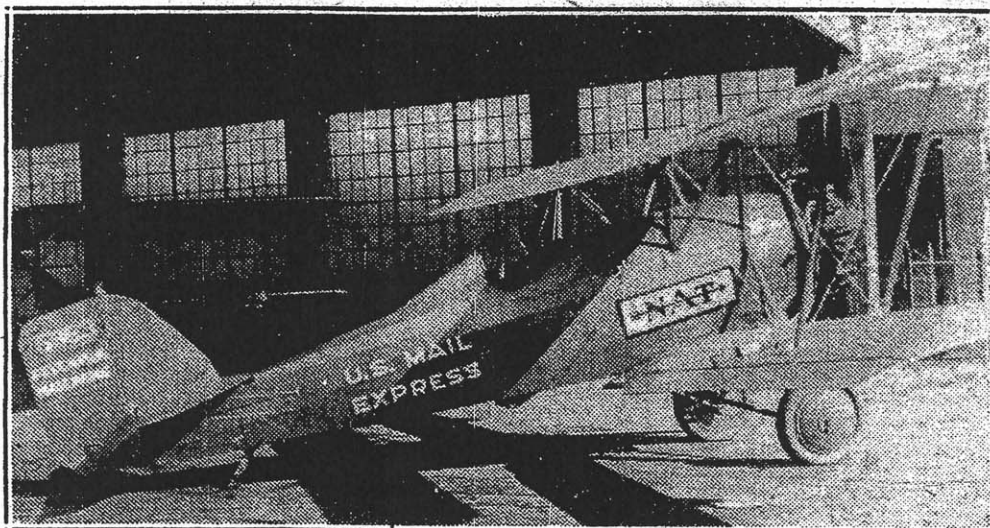

Tulsa looks to the air! For these are air days in Tulsa, what with 24 planes competing in the national air tour and several world famous pilots here, with the formal dedication of the municipal airport set for Thursday, with United States army fliers hastening here to participate in an air circus, and with the city's first air mail service to be instituted on the morrow.

Many Tulsans, indeed, will actually take to the air on this Fourth of July, for passenger flying is in order at both the municipal airport and the McIntyre airport throughout the day. Several passenger planes are at both ports and capable, experienced pilots are on hand to take those who want to go up, if

Tulsa will go on the air-mail map of the United States Thursday, when National Air Transport, Inc., operators of contract air-mail route No. 3 between Chicago and Dallas will extend their regular overnight service into Tulsa.

Earl Rockwood, field manager for National Air Transport, Inc., at Fort Worth, Texas, will be transferred to Tulsa to act as pilot. He will use the Pitcairn Mailwing, shown above, powered with a Wright Whirlwind motor, one of the newest and best types of airplanes designed especially for air mail service, on the 75-mile run between Tulsa and Ponca City, which is on the main line between Dallas and Chicago. The ship has a high speed of over 130 miles per hour fully loaded, making it one of the fastest types of commercial planes in the country. N. A. T. already has one of these ships in operation between Toledo and Detroit and its performance has been very satisfactory.

The schedule to be flown will be as follows: leave New York 12:15 p. m., Cleveland 4:20 p. m., Toledo 5:10 p. m., arrive Chicago 7 p. m., leave Chicago 8 p. m., Moline 9:50 p. m., Kansas City 1:10 a. m., Wichita 3:15 a. m., Ponca City 4:10 a. m., and arrive Tulsa 5:20 a. m.

The eastbound air-mail will leave Tulsa 6:30 p. m., Ponca City 10:50 p. m., Wichita 11:40 p. m., Kansas City 1:55 a. m., Moline 5:10 a. m., arrive Chicago 7 a. m., leave Chicago 8 a. m., Toledo 10:05 a. m., Cleveland 11 a. m., arrive New York 4:45 p. m.

This new service places Tulsa only nine hours from Chicago and through direct connection with the transcontinental air mail line places Oklahoma only 17 hours from New York City and less than 24 hours from Eastern seaboard cities extending from Washington, D. C., as far north as Rockland, Maine.
