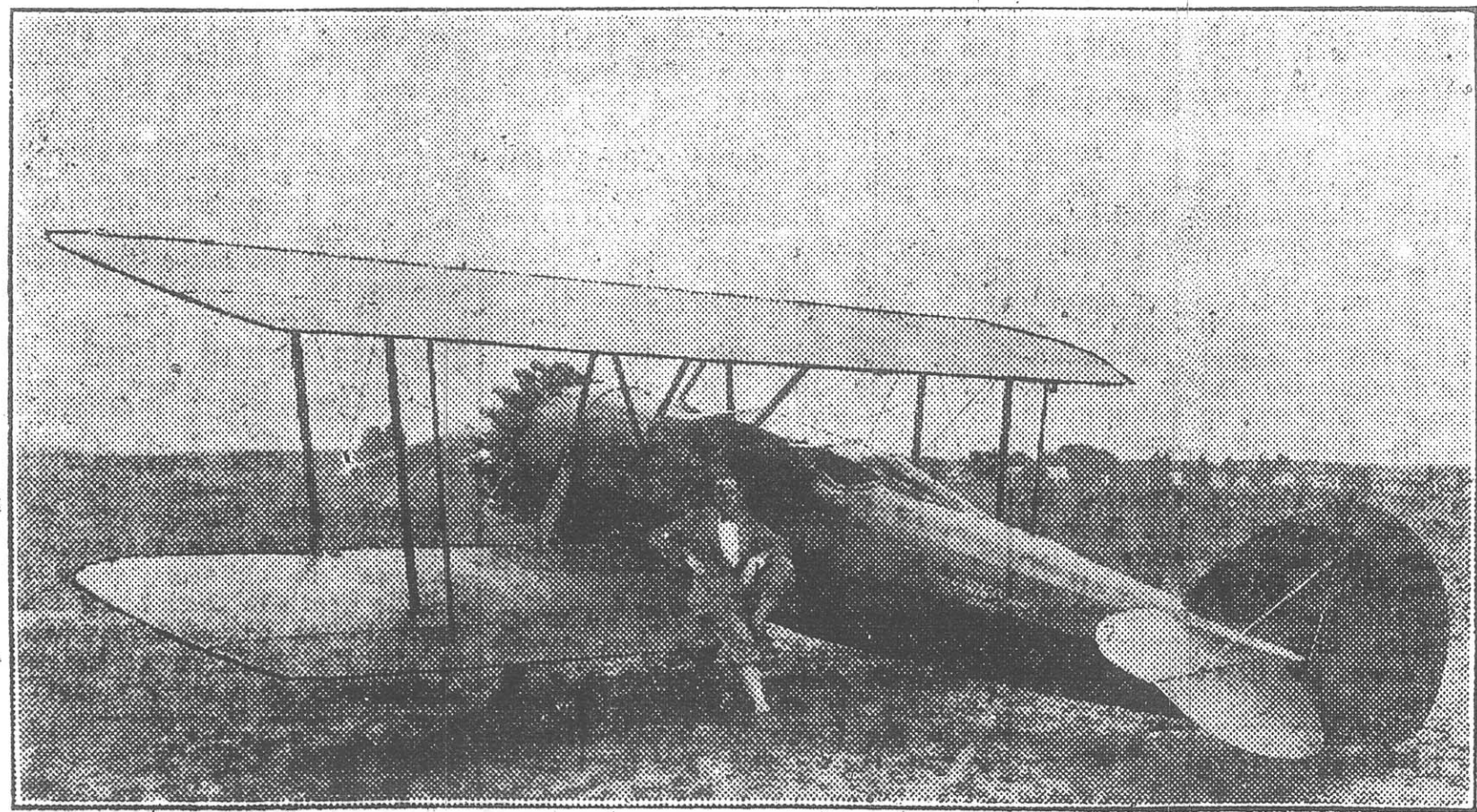

The Waco Ten biplane in which Pilot John P. Wood is making his way over the route of the national air tour is pictured above. This plane has carried Wood in the lead of the other pilots in the tour during the entire 6,000 mile jaunt. The Wausau pilot has earned a new record on the present tour by having a larger margin over second place than any previous winner has had in the three national air tours. Captain John Breene, who was here yesterday with the Curtis "Robin" plane, army pathfinder, said that Wood has earned for himself an enviable record and that he was one of the best pilots in the tour.
